

Financial Report: Lynn Northcutt

- September wasn't a good month financially, Questions and discussions took place about how various bills will be paid.
- Cider Cup and the Spooktacular Golf Scramble should bring in some revenue
- Labor Reduction should also help

Club Manager Report: Jim FUller

- Par 3 scheduled for 10/21
- Thursday League will be finished at the end of the month

**Grounds Report: Grant Howard** 

- Water will be shut off for the year on the course for a cost of \$1500. This includes blowing out the lines, winterizing and pumps.
- Greens conditions are improving but have not had any rain in over a month and that is what the greens require. Have covered areas on #9 and #4 and they seem to be growing.
- The greens are the main concern for next year, hoping to punch in March and seed with hope they will recover.

#### **Old Business**

Cider Cup is schedule for 10/22 & 10/23. The course will be closed to outside play.

#### **New Business**

- Chamber incentive memberships. This is just in the idea phase. Concerns voiced by merchants in chamber that are already members. Tabled and will discuss when more information is available.
- Talking with recreation department to host golf clinic event. Still in the planning phase.
- Youth Membership Price: Problems have occurred with disciplinary issues. Discussed ways
  to handle these when they arise. Going to discuss issues with managers and workers.
  Individuals no longer qualify for the youth membership when they graduate from high
  school.



#### Minutes Continued:

- Price for youth membership will remain the same at \$160 plus tax and the Youth on Course Fee.
- A motion was made and approved to offer a membership to individuals from High School Graduate - Age 23 at a cost of \$300 plus tax. They will be considered Jr. Membership eligible after that.
